Finding and Spreading the Joy in Flute Playing: Playing by Ear/Improvisation

When you take flute lessons, it seems (at least it was mostly that way for me) that one is given a lot of classical pieces, varieties of ways to practice scales, warm up, etc. As a young teen, I was enjoying playing most of what was assigned to me, but naturally hearing popular tunes on the radio or from watching TV, movies, etc. more modern and popular tunes would be heard and a desire to learn to play some of them came up. I recall asking my flute teacher what book I should purchase so could play "Raindrops Keep Fallin' on My Head"; his response was something like: ... "you don't need to buy music for that...why don't you figure out the tune and try it in (gave me a couple of keys) and play it at your next lesson...if you can play by ear, you can really expand your musician skills, be able to play about anything...."

I was able to do it, but it was, of course, a lot easier to have the notes and arrangements already written out. I continued playing in school and college bands....then much later, I found myself in a few situations playing in several different churches, singing solos, duets, trios, then later directing choirs. I had fun making a lot of my own arrangements of various church pieces, some of which were descants that could be played as part of the accompaniment for choir pieces. Learning better how to hear, read, and teach voice parts helped me figure out ways to include flute playing....I read or heard somewhere that the flute is the instrument that sounds most like the human voice; that makes sense to me...

After getting more experience choir directing (as a college student and at several other churches in early 80's) then in the late 90's and early 2000's I found myself involved in playing my flute (plus some singing) with some other church "Praise/Worship Teams" (which was what many churches were doing to replace much of the more traditional hymns/choir---the teams featured usually guitars, electric keyboards/piano, drums, and would play more popular modern gospel songs and traditional hymns also with more modern arrangements). Mostly I learned to develop flute parts by referring to the song sheets the team was given which had song lyrics and guitar chords and working out more precise arrangements during the practices.

Around fall 2012, I was invited (and began) to play flute along with church band in Perris, CA through one of my very best friends who understood how much I enjoy playing...the musicians were very friendly and seemed happy to have me participate in all the music they were doing. We would play before service started, during congregational and choir singing, and everything in between with NO printed music (only very rarely would we use sheet music --maybe about 3% of the time LOL). I recognized and could play without too much problem what they were playing....luckily, I was familiar with many of the gospel songs they would often play/perform since I heard/played/sang a lot of them in early 70's when I was in college, etc.

The music director ("Mike") was always very encouraging and appreciative, sometimes would be surprised that I already knew a lot of the songs they would play, sometimes might be surprised if I was playing in upper register or add other embellishments...it was such a fun team of musicians to work with. During choir practice I would often help choir sections learn their parts by playing along with them during their sectional practice...that also helped me get familiar with chords and patterns of each piece we were practicing so I would make a few handwritten notes to remind me what notes "were working" for my part. Many times, for reasons I usually wasn't aware of, the director would change the key of the song we were playing...somehow, I just told myself to "relax, listen and figure it out as you go". Once I figured out what harmony parts I was playing (during choir/band practices), I could fairly accurately switch to the new key (new to me, anyway).

Every so often, Mike would have me play a solo, usually at the beginning of a song during the introduction...usually not a problem for me...but one time he was telling the band to "be quiet...Diana is going to play a solo at the beginning...you guys come in when the choir comes in". I had absolutely NO recollection of the song or how it went...fortunately Mike was playing organ behind me and told me what key it was in (maybe key of F?) So, I took a big breath and started playing some kind of creative ditty following whatever tempo or chords Mike was playing behind me...I think I did it all with my eyes closed and lasted about 8-12 measures... I must have played something that seemed musical.....people who weren't involved in the music were listening contentedly; then choir started singing at their cue--the floor did not open up and suck me down into the bowels of the earth...

At the end of the service, my good friend came up to me and told me how much she enjoyed the solo I played during the choir piece...asked me what it was. I told her the truth and we both had a great laugh together. It was at that point I realized that the more experience I had gotten playing by ear/improvising, etc. the more comfortable I got with it---that I could claim that I now "specialize in playing songs I don't know"....although it does help if others aren't sure what the song is either. It's just music...and it is SO much fun and I love doing some of the free lance stuff when the opportunities arise. Ever since I made it through that performance, I think I stopped getting nervous playing in public...getting nervous never helped anyway--- and most likely no one will know what my part was supposed to sound like--of course, neither did I--so let's just have fun playing music!
